## **Our Services**

#### Eat with us

Everyone is welcome at our community meal Monday to Friday, Brekky Clubs and Community Suppers, it works just like your favourite café, except all food is offered on a 'donate as you dine' basis, so anyone can access nutritious meals despite their budget.

#### Volunteer

Supporting over 190 community volunteers and 93 from corporate partnerships, our volunteer programme improves catering and hospitality skills in a nurturing and safe environment. As a result of this programme, some volunteers have successfully gained employment, others have set up their own catering businesses and some reported improved language development and confidence.

#### **Meals and Chat**

We ensure that vulnerable and isolated residents of Hammersmith and Fulham have access to nutritious, homemade meals and someone to speak with through our friendly delivery service. Meals and a Chat provides residents with an essential welfare check, with riders working closely with the Adult Social Care team. Meals delivered by electric-cargo bikes and riders ground our mission as an environmental organisation.

#### **NOURISHed (Education)**

Multiple week courses, one-off and bespoke sessions improve residents' cookery skills, healthy eating knowledge whilst learning to fight food waste. With the focus on cooking with what you have, mindful of resident's access to food, the social environment gives residents confidence to <u>develop</u> their skills.

## Climate Action

As a member of the H&F Climate Alliance, we recognise the need for organisations to take rapid climate action to deliver net zero greenhouse gas emissions by 2030 for the borough of Hammersmith & Fulham and want to play our part in achieving this. We commit to the below H&F Climate Alliance pledge principles:

**LEARN:** To measure our greenhouse gas emissions to understand our main climate impacts and monitor these on an ongoing basis.

PLAN: To develop and implement a Climate Action Plan.

**SHARE:** To share progress made and climate action taken with H&F Council and Climate Alliance members each year.

## **Partnerships**

Nourish Hub has partnered with over 80 local charities, schools and businesses since its launch, offering services from education to food provision. Partnerships with community groups and within the local authority have been key in adding value to our services.

Sitting on the Cost-Of-Living Working Group, Nourish Hub supports the research, procurement and implementation of a borough-wide signposting tool. Nourish Hub co-chairs the Food For All Partnership and secured Greater London Authority funding to recruit a Partnership Coordinator. This post has been an integral part of the progression of the council's Food Plan.

Dr Bike, delivered in partnership with the Environment Department - Smarter Transport on Wednesdays, enables residents to access bicycle maintenance for free, and supports the borough's Climate Mission.

The Nourish Hub team are also representatives of Hammersmith and Fulham Primary Care Network, Provider of Older Peoples Services Forum (POPS) and Dementia Action Alliance to name a few.
